


o tell the tale of Nathaniel's Journey we need to go way back to when he was just a little boy, visiting his grandfather.


A tear trickled down Nathaniel's face. "But my grandfather told me that the King loves everyone."

With a cruel sneer the man pushed Nathaniel aside. "Now get out of my way. I've got more important things to think about than your problems."








Nathaniel was walking like this when he bumped into a man who was crawling on his hands and knees. The man seemed to be searching for something.

The woman cut him off with a wave of her hand. "Just think of it as a gift from the King," she said as she handed him a pass.


"You mean I can have it? For free?"

"Are you sure you're supposed to give this sword to me? I mean, why would the King want me to have this sword? I'm not a warrior. I'm just Nathaniel."


"He must think you're pretty important. He had me risk my life to bring it to you. Whatever you do, don't lose it."

The King specifically asked that I give you this radio."


"How do I turn it on?" Nathaniel asked as he studied the radio. "There's no on or off switch."


"I, ahhh, I was given this sword by the King," Nathaniel stammered. "He made it just for me."


The children stopped their game and stared. Finally, a little girl

"Because the King told me to tell other people about his Kingdom," Nathaniel answered. "Someday I'll get to go there, but right now I'm supposed to help other people find the way."


By this time, the children were crowded around Nathaniel. "Do you have any extra passes we could have? We want to meet the King






you home."











"Sir," Nathaniel shouted into the King's ear, "what are they cheering for?"

EXPLANATION 23

Nathaniel's Journey is a parable. A parable is a short story that tells a truth about God. When Jesus talked with his followers he often spoke in parables. Like the parables Jesus told in the Bible, Nathaniel's Journey teaches us about God. This is the meaning of Nathaniel's Journey:

Nathaniel is just like every other person in the world. He is like you. He is like me. Nathaniel had a deep desire to reach the Kingdom Beyond the Woods and to meet the King. All people have a deep desire to meet God. But in the same way that Nathaniel didn't know how to find the King, most people don't know how or where to find God.





When Nathaniel started his journey into the deep woods, he met a man who said that the King wouldn't want to meet Nathaniel. The man said that the King wanted warriors, not nobodies like Nathaniel. Many people think that they are not special enough for God. But what they don't know is that God made them. And God doesn't make mistakes. In fact, when God made you, He used the most perfect pattern there was. Himself.



o God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. Genesis 1:27

After Nathaniel left the large man, he started walking through the woods, trying to find his way to the Kingdom Beyond the Woods. The way was very dark, and it was hard to walk. While he was walking, he bumped into a man who was looking for a pass into the Kingdom Beyond the Woods. This news surprised Nathaniel. He didn't know you need a pass. But it was the law of the land.



God has a law too. His law says that no one can enter the Kingdom of Heaven without a relationship with Jesus. Jesus said,






nd the words of the LORD are flawless, like silver refined in a furnace of clay, purified seven times. Psalm 12:6
